Skill

Search for Leaders is focusing our ministry time on finding and training future leaders. Leaders have a clear vision and mobilize those around them.

Design

Search for Leaders (man/woman/network) > The picture illustrates the key to finding leaders: they will gather others. The **sketch** is an open door illustrating that true people of peace not only open their hearts to Jesus' lordship, but also their home, family, community, and tribe. They catch No Place Left vision.

Story

Peace House Strategy (Luke 10:1-24)

This story demonstrates Search for Leaders as a kingdom skill because we clearly see Jesus train His disciples in a simple strategy to find future leaders. One key is to share the gospel as quickly as possible, because a true person of peace receives the peace we offer in the name of Jesus. Another key is to stay in the same place once the Holy Spirit guides us to the house of peace.

Scriptures

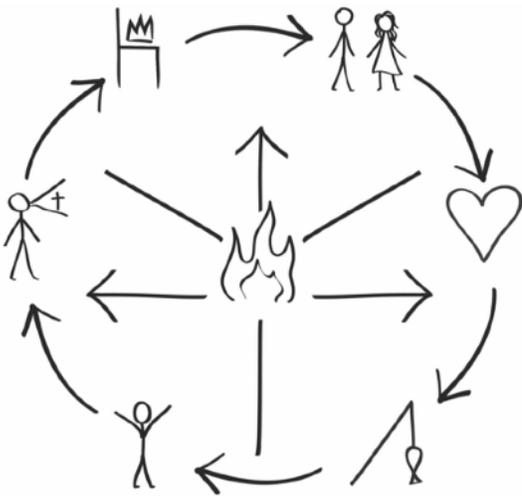
Luke 10:17-20 > The Seventy returned with joy saying, "Lord, even the demons submit to us in Your name." Jesus replied, "I watched Satan fall from heaven like a lightning flash. Look, I have given you the authority to trample on snakes and scorpions and over all the power of the enemy; nothing will ever harm you. However, don't rejoice that the spirits submit to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven.

1 Timothy 4:12 > Let no one despise your youth; instead, you should be an example to the believers in speech, conduct, love, faith, and purity.

Lesson Summary

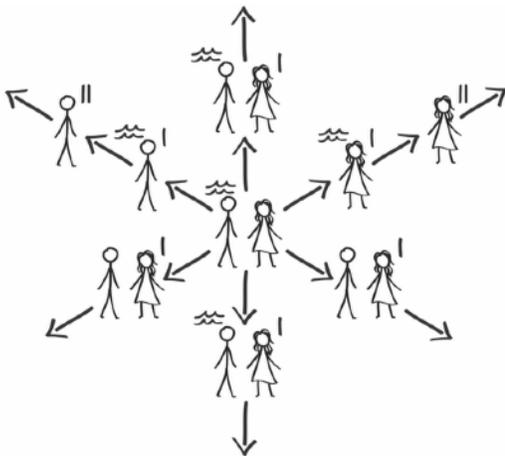
Search for Leaders requires focus, teamwork, and above all, humility. Jesus caught His disciples arguing over which one of them was the best leader, and He taught them that the greatest leader in any group is the servant of everyone (Luke 22:26). When Jesus invited Matthew to follow Him, He knew He had identified a future leader because that evening His new disciple invited all of his friends over for a meal to meet Jesus and hear Him teach (Matthew 9:10). When Peter went to share about Jesus with Cornelius, he had already gathered his whole family to hear the good news, and they all believed (Acts 10:33-48).

Gathering Guide



- Holy Spirit (fire): Let the Spirit guide your meeting.
- **Step One** (back arrow): Last week questions.
- Abide (worshipper): How did you abide last week?
- Harvest (witness): Whom did you share with?
- **Step Two** (up arrow): Discover this week's skill in Scripture as you discuss the Bible story.
- God (throne/crown): What do we learn about God?
- People (man/woman): What do we learn about people?
- Practice: Practice telling this week's story in groups.
- **Step Three** (forward arrow): Next week questions.
- Abide (heart): How will you abide?
- Harvest (fishing): Whom will you share with?

Generations Map



- People of Peace (people/arrows): Draw your disciples and their disciples. Share recent stories of how you and your team are engaging lost people.
- Baptism (waves): Update your map with those who have been baptized. What is the next step for each disciple who still needs to be baptized or become a baptizer by experience?
- Generations (number lines): Update your map with generations. How can we pray for this movement?
